#### PANELISTS

#### Keynote speaker

**Carlos M. P. Sousa** is Full Professor of Marketing and Business Strategy at Molde University College in Norway. He received his Ph.D. from University College Dublin (Ireland). Previously, he was an Assistant Professor at University College Dublin and a Full Professor at Durham University (UK). Professor Sousa is an Associate Editor of the Journal of Business Research and Associate Editor of International Marketing Review. He has been a visiting professor at universities in Australia, Brazil, Chile, Ireland, Italy, Portugal, Spain, and the UK. Professor Sousa has published over 70 articles, in journals such as Research Policy, Journal of Product Innovation Management, Journal of Business Research, Journal of International Marketing, Journal of World Business, Global Strategy Journal, and British Journal of Management. In March 2021, Professor Sousa was awarded the 2021 Hans B. Thorelli Award by the American Marketing Association.

**Jochen Faget.** Born in 1958, in Germany. Reporter. He has worked for several public radio stations in Germany for 30 years (Deutsche Welle, Bayerischer Rundfunk, Norddeutscher Rundfunk, Deutschlandradio, etc.). He has published several books and done extensive coverage and in-depth reports in countries such as Macau, Timor-Leste, Fiji, Cabo Verde, Guiné-Bissau and São Tomé e Príncipe.

**Agostinho Silva.** CEO of CEI-Zipor Engineering Group. Professor and researcher in the areas of industrial engineering. Ph.D in Business Administration at the Faculty of Economics, University of Évora and Ph.D in Industrial Engineering at the Faculty of Engineering, University of Porto. Professor at the School of Technology and Management of the Polytechnic Institute of Leiria, Portugal. Member of the research center MARE - Marine and Environmental Sciences. Presentations at national and international conferences and author of several scientific articles. His research focuses on Industry 4.0, Cyber-Physical Systems, Marine Biotechnology, and Tech-Services Ecosystems.

**Rui Pedro.** CFO of Movicortes Group. Movicortes S.A. is a company founded about 35 years ago and which started its business activity in the equipment sector. As the business of Movicortes diversified it created, in 1989, specialized and independent companies for each of the businesses and it evolved into a service and asset management company, responsible for the management of the group companies. Movicortes operates in several industries (e.g. vehicles, industrial machinery, agricultural machinery, wine, etc.) across several continents.



**Vitor Corado Simões.** Vítor Corado Simões has served for many years as professor at ISEG – Instituto Superior de Economia e Gestão (University of Lisbon), until his retirement in April 2020. His research addresses two main fields: International Management and Innovation Management. He participated in the evaluation of research at the University of Uppsala (2012). He has worked as consultant to OECD, UNIDO, and the European Commission. Together with Manuel Mira Godinho, he has developed yearly reports on Portugal's Research and Innovation Policy for the EU Research and Innovation Observatory. He has published in Portuguese and international journals. Professor Simões served as President of the European International Business Academy (EIBA) in 1993, and is now Fellow of this Academy. He is leading (with John Cantwell and Philippe Gugler) the research project on the History of EIBA. Professor Simões is a founding member of Iberian International Business Conference.


#### LOCATIONS
